Nebo District Areas of Focus

- Students have access to college courses including receiving their associate's degree upon graduation.
- Ninety-one percent of Nebo student graduates took at least one Concurrent

Placement, or MATC class during their high school experience to help them become college and career ready.

- Advanced Placement (AP) students, in 20 different classes, earned 5,537 college credits.
- Nebo students, in 60 different classes, earned approximately 13,934 college credits by successfully completing Concurrent Enrollment classes.

- Nebo School District saved parents and students over \$2.9 million in the 2015-16 school year by providing Concurrent Enrollment and AP classes for college credit.
- Nebo District's Career and Technical Education students passed
 7,714 Skill Certification tests-more than any previous year.
- Nebo students' *test scores* continue to *increase* in *mathematics*, *science*, and *writing*.
- Nebo School District has a graduation rate of 90 percent, which is significantly higher than the state average of 84 percent.
- The Nebo Education Foundation received approximately \$200,000 in donations to fund projects in schools.
- More than \$18.1 million was awarded in scholarships to our graduates this past year.
- Nebo District belongs to the Utah Valley University K-16 Alliance and is a member of the Brigham Young University Public School Partnership.

- Nebo District consistently scores extremely well on beginning and end-of-level assessments.
- Nebo District operates 29 elementary schools, 13 secondary schools, and 5 special program schools.
- Nebo District is the **sixth-largest** district in Utah.
- Nebo District's 156 buses travel approximately 9,096 miles per day or 1.61 million miles each year.
- Nebo District serves 17,604 meals per day or 3.11 million meals each year
- Nebo District is the fifth-largest employer in Utah County with approximately 3,600 full- and part-time employees.

The ALC provides early college and career courses to high school students while students stay involved at their primary school. The ALC offers a wide variety of courses for college credit, career readiness, and industry

certification. Courses include computer programming and repair, digital media and video production, medical science, criminal justice, building construction, and engineering/drafting. Technology



- Our district continues to **emphasize technology integration** including LCD projectors, audio enhancement systems, document cameras, hand-held devices, and mobile labs in classrooms to engage teachers and students in **21st Century** teaching and learning.
- Currently, there are 155 wired computer labs that include
 6,000 computers, 10 wireless mobile laptop/Netbook labs that include
 360 devices, 35 iPad labs with sync carts that include 1,200 devices, and
 230 wireless Chromebook labs that

include over **13,000 devices** in 42 schools and 5 programs. Students use hundreds of personal technology devices daily.
