Nebo District Areas of Focus

- Students have access to college courses and an ability to earn their associate's degree upon graduation.
- Ninety-six percent of Nebo student graduates took at least one Concurrent Enrollment,



Advanced

Placement, or MATC class during their high school experience to help them become college and career ready.

- Advanced Placement (AP) students, in 20 different classes, earned 4,559 college credits.
- Nebo students, in approximately 50 different classes, earned 16,860 college credits by successfully completing Concurrent Enrollment classes.

- Nebo School District saved parents and students over \$5.6 million in the 2016-17 school year by providing Concurrent Enrollment and AP classes for college credit.
- Nebo District's Career and Technical Education students passed 8,260 Skill Certification tests.
- Nebo School District has a *graduation rate* of *90* percent, which is *significantly higher* than the state average of *85* percent.
- The Nebo Education Foundation received approximately \$200,000 in donations to fund projects in schools.
- More than \$17.1 million was awarded in scholarships to our graduates this past year.
- Nebo District belongs to the Utah Valley University K-16 Alliance and is a member of the Brigham Young University Public School Partnership.

Nebo School District Seeks Public Input



FOCUS ON STUDENT GROWTH

During the month of October 2017, Nebo School District will provide a survey for the public to give input regarding a proposed tax-neutral bond election to be held on November 6, 2018, for future facility projects.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will the bond increase my property tax rate? Current projections show that Nebo School District can bond without increasing property tax rates (also known as a property tax-neutral bond). Homeowner's property taxes would stay the same, provided that their assessed value does not change.

Where can 9 find the survey? The survey will be sent electronically to parents who have children enrolled in Nebo School District. The survey will also be available for the general public at www.nebo.edu and through Nebo's social media sites.

Why does Nebo School District need to bond? Nebo continues to grow by approximately 500 students each year. Bond money is used to build new schools and make improvements to existing schools.

Do you know of any specific projects yet? Recent public survey results informed Nebo School District that the majority of parents were extremely interested in having their sixth- and seventh-grade students in middle schools for academic and social reasons. Therefore, Nebo School District is proposing to build three new middle schools. These schools will be located within the boundaries of Springville High, Maple Mountain High, and Salem Hills High.

What are the benefits to building middle schools?

Along with academic and social reasons,
Nebo students can have a "direct alignment pattern" in their secondary schools.
A "direct alignment pattern" means that all students in a middle school will go to the



same junior high school and then to the same high school. In other words, the high school boundary will share the same boundary with a junior high and middle school

Do you have plans to rebuild the Payson, Spanish Jork, and Springville High Schools? Yes. Projections show that building middle schools should enable Nebo to handle enrollment growth for several years without building additional new elementary schools. Nebo School District will then focus financial resources towards the reconstruction of these three high schools.

Nebo School District:

- consistently scores very well on beginning and end-of-level assessments.
- operates 29 elementary schools, 13 secondary schools, and 5 special program schools.
- is the *sixth-largest* district in Utah.
- has 150 buses that travel approximately 8,766 miles per day or 1.55 million miles each year.
- serves 17,001 meals per day or 3 million meals each year.
- is the fifth-largest employer in Utah County with approximately 3,800 full- and part-time employees.

College and Career Ready

Every Nebo student can be prepared to *succeed* in college and in workforce training. Students can earn *college credit* through Advanced Placement (AP) and Concurrent Enrollment classes.

- The Advanced Learning Center (ALC) provides early college and career courses to high school students while students stay involved at their primary school. The ALC offers a wide variety of courses including aviation, computer programming and repair, digital media, audio engineering, video production, medical science, criminal justice, building construction, engineering, robotics, manufacturing, and teacher education.
